



## Daily Life

• Breakfast (Colazione)

7:00 AM - 9:00 AM usually light (coffee and pastries)

- Lunch (Pranzo)
- 1:00 PM 2:30 PM a main meal often including multiple courses
- Dinner (Cena) 8:00 PM - 10:00 PM usually a relaxed, multi-course meal



Retail Stores

Typically open 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM and 3:00 PM - 7:00 PM, closed for a midday break

Restaurants/Cafés

Often open from 7:00 AM - 11:00 PM, with varying hours for lunch and dinner

Markets

Commonly open 7:00 AM - 1:00 PM; some have extended hours on weekends.
