Application Details

Language Requirements

Italian: Minimum A1 level. An Entry Test is required for Erasmus+ students.

English: Minimum B1 level. English certification is required for Erasmus+ students accessing English-language courses.

<u>Language Requirements</u>

GPA Requirements

There is no minimum GPA requirement to participate in the exchange programme, but some courses may have certain prerequisites.

Course load

The usual workload is 30 ECTS credits per semester. UniMC offers bachelor and master level courses.

Choosing courses

The University of Macerata primarily offers <u>courses in Italian</u>, with some departments providing <u>courses in English</u>. International students should prioritize course selection in the department they are nominated to. All courses are available to both international students and university undergraduates.
