1. Application Deadlines

To participate in the Erasmus+ program at UniMC, you must complete the **online application form** by the deadlines below:

- **Fall Semester / Full Academic Year:** Submit by **May 20**
- **Spring Semester:** Submit by **October 30**

2. Language Requirements

Studying in Italy means engaging with a new language. Here's what you need for your study period at the University of Macerata:



Italian

- **Minimum A1 level** required for all incoming students
- Free **50-hour beginner course in September (Fall) and January (Spring)**
- **Compulsory placement test registration:**
 - **Fall Semester / Full Academic Year:** Submit by **May 20**
 - **Spring Semester:** Submit by **October 30**

English

- **Minimum B1 level** to attend courses taught in English
- Note: Even for English-taught classes, **basic Italian (A1)** is mandatory

3. Accommodation

You may request a room in **University Residences** through your application. These are limited and assigned based on availability.

Key Dates:

- **Confirmation in Mid-July** → Fall Semester / Full Year
- **Confirmation in Mid-November** → Spring Semester

If not assigned, you'll need to find **private housing**. We suggest starting early (May–June) to secure a place.

4. Health Insurance

All students must have **valid health insurance** in **Italian or English** for the duration of their stay.

This is especially important for **non-EU students**, as it is required to apply for a **residence permit**.

5. Visa & Police Registration (Non-EU Only)

Depending on your citizenship and how long you're staying, there are different requirements:

- **Non-EU Students coming from a European University:** Must submit a **Declaration of Presence** once arrived in Macerata with your EU residence permit.
- **Non-EU Students:**
 - Staying **under 90 days**: Apply for visa only
 - Staying **over 90 days**: Apply for a **residence permit (permesso di soggiorno)** within 8 working days of arrival

6. Codice Fiscale (Italian Tax Code)

This code is essential for many procedures in Italy (banking, phone SIM, contracts).

- You must **apply before arrival**
- Required to **complete registration** at UniMC

7. Courses & Learning Agreement

To ensure academic success and proper credit recognition, your **Learning Agreement** must follow these rules:

- Choose **at least 51% of your ECTS credits** from your **assigned exchange department**
- You may take courses from:
 - Bachelor's Degree Programs (L)
 - Master's Degree Programs (LM)
- Submit as a **PDF signed by your Departmental Coordinator**
- The final list of available courses will be published in **June 2025**

8. Courses Taught in English

While Italian is the main language of instruction, UniMC offers several **modules and full courses in English**, especially in areas like:



- Economics
- Political Science and Communication
- Cultural Heritage and Tourism
- Law
- Languages

Requirements:

- B1 level in English
- A1 level in Italian

9. Academic Calendar

The academic calendar includes semester start/end dates, exam sessions, and breaks.

- The **2025/26 academic calendar** is currently being finalized
- It will be published by **June 2025**

10. Erasmus Buddy Programme

Get paired with a **local UniMC student** who will help you feel at home. Your buddy can assist with:

- Airport/train station pickup
- Finding your accommodation
- Learning the city
- Making friends and joining local activities

You'll be contacted:

- **August** → Fall arrivals
- **January** → Spring arrivals

Check the “**Erasmus+ Buddy**” box in your application to join.

11. Welcome Day & Arrival Tips

We recommend arriving a few days early to adjust and settle in:



- **Fall Semester Arrival Window: September 10–15, 2025**
- **Spring Semester Arrival Window: February 10–15, 2026**

Important: Please double-check the academic calendar for any early-start teaching activities scheduled by your exchange Department.

Welcome Day Events:

Held shortly before courses begin, Welcome Day includes:

- Official welcome & campus orientation
- Guided tours of the university & city
- Registration assistance
- Meet your Buddy & International Office staff
- Sign-up for free Italian courses
- Meet other international students

Final date & program will be sent via email before your arrival.
